The Theology and Action Research Network (TARN) annual seminar this year is focused on using theological action research and the four voices of theology in doctoral research. Through a panel of three people who are engaging with or have engaged in theological action research in their doctoral work, we will dive into the particularities and complexities of navigating theological action research in doctoral research. The panellists are Stefanie Conradt, Elizabeth Ridley and Curtis Love.

Stefanie Conradt completed her PhD in practical theology, awarded by the University of St Andrews in 2023. She is now employed by Regent's Park College, Oxford, working on a project addressing loneliness and isolation experienced by older people in the Northeast. This project is funded by the William Leech Research Fund.

Elizabeth Ridley is experienced in parish pastoral work and chaplaincy. She is currently writing up her DTh at Roehampton University, London. Her doctorate focuses on the potential for evangelisation of the Ignatian practices in the Week of Accompanied Prayer.

Curtis Love is a doctoral student and lecturer at the University of South Africa (teaching in theological ethics) and is interested in pedagogy, decoloniality, theological education and participatory approaches to (almost) everything.

After hearing from the panel there will be responses from both **Dr Clare Watkins** and **Dr Helen Cameron**. There will also be plenty of opportunity for wider questions and discussion.
