Christian Faith and Christian Learning: a theological action research approach. Clare Watkins and James Butler, Routledge 2026.

This book is the fruit of a five-year theological action research project, that James and Clare carried out at eight 'sites of learning' in the British Methodist Church. In keeping with theological action research sensibilities, the main body of the book takes the reader on a journey of conversation and reflection, informed by contemporary practice and experience, scripture, academic theology, and the wider Christian tradition. What results is a radical reframing of how 'Christian learning' might be construed, privileging the 'learning in ordinary' of quotidian lived faith. Such a framing carries with it implications for how teaching, learning, and training is best understood for our churches, and

contributes to renewed theological thinking on faith, knowing, and what it means to be a 'disciple' of Jesus.
